## Overview of the School

Randall Park High School's Educational Program is based upon the premise that at-risk students have different needs, learn at different rates and have diverse learning styles which are not currently being addressed by traditional public schools and may cause many of these students to drop out of school.

## Our Program

Randall Park High School provides a teacher-assisted, computer-based learning environment in which students may work at their own pace. The staff of Highly Qualified Teachers and licensed professionals provides students with the individual attention they need to achieve academic success. Once a student has enrolled, the experience begins with orientation, where the students are transitioned into our unique academic model. We individually assess each student's needs and abilities and create a learning plan uniquely designed to ensure that our students receive the necessary support and resources to graduate with a state-recognized diploma. Randall Park High School uses the Apex Learning Series for our core curriculum subjects. The Apex Learning Series is aligned with Ohio State Standards and includes reading, language arts, mathematics, social studies, and science.

## Academic Goals

- Our goal is to provide all students with supportive academic, employability, and life skills they need to earn a high school diploma and succeed in life. Randall Park High School • accomplishes this goal by the following: Providing development-level- appropriate academic instruction through state-of-the-art, researched-based curricula that meet the educational needs of each student and allow each student to begin at the academic level and advance at his or her own pace.
- Providing needed social counseling for students who face significant social boundaries to attendance and educational advancement.
  - Providing flexible scheduling so that each student can attend to his or her responsibilities, such as childcare or work, while obtaining an education at the same time, instead of having to choose between life's necessities and education.
  - Teaching valuable life skills courses, job readiness training and employment preparation and placement as well as the required basic academics, in order to prepare our students for success in the workplace and in the classroom.

This will be accomplished by emphasizing the development of both cognitive and social skills. Randall Park High School offers a safe, secure, clean environment, and researched field-tested educational programs which have proven very successful in educating at-risk students. The program provides the opportunity for parent involvement and community engagement.

## Sponsor Compliance Data

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance. As part of the monitoring process, the performance of the school on each of the required Ohio School Report Card components is assessed and evaluated. Additionally, St. Aloysius has a regular presence at school board meetings where student performance indicators such as attendance, behavior, and academic achievement are tracked and financial and organizational issues that impact student success are reviewed and discussed. Keys to oversight, monitoring, and support is St. Aloysius's review of the school's Ohio Improvement Process (OIP) plan development and implementation. As a result of our thorough oversight and monitoring, St. Aloysius has determined that this school is substantially compliant with the rules and regulations governing community schools.
